

# Internet Explorer 9 Keyboard Shortcuts

## Viewing and exploring webpages

<b>F1</b>	Display Help
<b>F11</b>	Toggle between full-screen and regular views of the browser window
<b>Tab</b>	Move forward through the items on a webpage, the Address bar, or the Favorites bar
<b>Shift+Tab</b>	Move back through the items on a webpage, the Address bar, or the Favorites bar
<b>F7</b>	Start Caret Browsing
<b>Alt+Home</b>	Go to your home page
<b>Alt+Right Arrow</b>	Go to the next page
<b>Alt+Left Arrow or Backspace</b>	Go to the previous page
<b>Shift+F10</b>	Display a shortcut menu for a link
<b>Ctrl+Tab or F6</b>	Move forward through frames and browser elements (only works if tabbed browsing is turned off)
<b>Ctrl+Shift+Tab</b>	Move backward between frames (only works if tabbed browsing is turned off)
<b>Up Arrow</b>	Scroll toward the beginning of a document
<b>Down Arrow</b>	Scroll toward the end of a document
<b>Page Up</b>	Scroll toward the beginning of a document in larger increments
<b>Page Down</b>	Scroll toward the end of a document in larger increments
<b>Home</b>	Move to the beginning of a document
<b>End</b>	Move to the end of a document
<b>Ctrl+F</b>	Find on this page
<b>F5</b>	Refresh the current webpage
<b>Ctrl+F5</b>	Refresh the current webpage, even if the time stamp for the web version and your locally stored version are the same
<b>Esc</b>	Stop downloading a page
<b>Ctrl+O</b>	Open a new website or page
<b>Ctrl+N</b>	Open a new window
<b>Ctrl+Shift+P</b>	Open a new InPrivate Browsing window
<b>Ctrl+Shift+Delete</b>	Delete browsing history
<b>Ctrl+K</b>	Duplicate tab (open current tab in a new tab)
<b>Ctrl+Shift+T</b>	Reopen the last tab you closed
<b>Ctrl+W</b>	Close the current window (if you only have one tab open)
<b>Ctrl+S</b>	Save the current page
<b>Ctrl+P</b>	Print the current page or active frame
<b>Enter</b>	Activate a selected link
<b>Ctrl+I</b>	Open Favorites
<b>Ctrl+H</b>	Open History
<b>Ctrl+J</b>	Open Download Manager
<b>Alt+P</b>	Open the Page menu (if the Command bar is visible)
<b>Alt+T</b>	Open the Tools menu (if the Command bar is visible)
<b>Alt+H</b>	Open the Help menu (if the Command bar is visible)

## Working with tabs

<b>Ctrl+click</b>	Open links in a new tab in the background
<b>Ctrl+Shift+click</b>	Open links in a new tab in the foreground
<b>Ctrl+T</b>	Open a new tab in the foreground
<b>Ctrl+Tab or Ctrl+Shift+Tab</b>	Switch between tabs
<b>Ctrl+W</b>	Close current tab (or the current window if tabbed browsing is turned off)
<b>Ctrl+n (where n is a number between 1 and 8)</b>	Switch to a specific tab number
<b>Ctrl+9</b>	Switch to the last tab
<b>Ctrl+Alt+F4</b>	Close other tabs

# Internet Explorer 9 Keyboard Shortcuts

## Using zoom

<b>Ctrl+Plus Sign</b>	Increase zoom (+ 10%)
<b>Ctrl+Minus Sign</b>	Decrease zoom (- 10%)
<b>Ctrl+0</b>	Zoom to 100%

## Using search in the Address bar

<b>Ctrl+E</b>	Open a search query in the Address bar
<b>Alt+Enter</b>	Open your search query in a new tab
<b>Ctrl+Down Arrow</b>	Open the Address bar menu (to view history, favorites, and search providers)
<b>Ctrl+Shift+L</b>	Search using copied text

## Using Print Preview

<b>Alt+P</b>	Set printing options and print the page
<b>Alt+U</b>	Change paper, headers and footers, orientation, and margins for this page
<b>Alt+Home</b>	Display the first page to be printed
<b>Alt+Left Arrow</b>	Display the previous page to be printed
<b>Alt+A</b>	Type the number of the page you want displayed
<b>Alt+Right Arrow</b>	Display the next page to be printed
<b>Alt+End</b>	Display the last page to be printed
<b>Alt+F</b>	Specify how you want frames to print (this option is available only if you're printing a webpage that uses frames)
<b>Alt+C</b>	Close Print Preview
	Using the Address bar
	The following table describes shortcuts used on the Address bar.
<b>Alt+D</b>	Select the text in the Address bar
<b>F4</b>	Display a list of addresses you've typed
<b>Ctrl+Left Arrow</b>	When in the Address bar, move the cursor left to the next logical break in the address (period or slash)
<b>Ctrl+Right Arrow</b>	When in the Address bar, move the cursor right to the next logical break in the address (period or slash)
<b>Ctrl+Enter</b>	Add www. to the beginning and .com to the end of the text typed in the Address bar
<b>Up Arrow</b>	Move forward through the list of AutoComplete matches
<b>Down Arrow</b>	Move back through the list of AutoComplete matches

## Opening Internet Explorer toolbar menus

<b>Alt+M</b>	Open the Home menu
<b>Alt+R</b>	Open the Print menu
<b>Alt+J</b>	Open the RSS menu
<b>Alt+O</b>	Open the Tools menu
<b>Alt+S</b>	Open the Safety menu
<b>Alt+L</b>	Open the Help menu

## Working with feeds, history, and favorites

<b>Ctrl+D</b>	Add the current page to your favorites (or subscribe to the feed when in feed preview)
<b>Ctrl+Shift+Del</b>	Delete browsing history
<b>Ctrl+Shift+P</b>	Open an InPrivate Browsing window
<b>Ctrl+B</b>	Open the Organize Favorites dialog box
<b>Alt+Up Arrow</b>	Move selected item up in the Favorites list in the Organize Favorites dialog box
<b>Alt+Down Arrow</b>	Move selected item down in the Favorites list in the Organize Favorites dialog box
<b>Alt+C</b>	Open Favorites Center and display your favorites
<b>Ctrl+H</b>	Open Favorites Center and display your history
<b>Ctrl+Shift+H</b>	Pin Favorites Center and display your history
<b>Ctrl+Shift+J</b>	Open and dock the Favorites Center and display your feeds
<b>Alt+Z</b>	Open the Add to Favorites menu (or open Subscribe to feed when in feed preview)

# Internet Explorer 9 Keyboard Shortcuts

<b>Alt+A</b>	Open the Favorites menu from the menu bar
<b>Editing</b>	
<b>Ctrl+X</b>	Remove the selected items and copy them to the Clipboard
<b>Ctrl+C</b>	Copy the selected items to the Clipboard
<b>Ctrl+V</b>	Insert the contents of the Clipboard at the selected location
<b>Ctrl+A</b>	Select all items on the current webpage
<b>F12</b>	Open Internet Explorer Developer Tools
<b>Using the Notification bar</b>	
<b>Alt+N</b>	Move focus to the Notification bar
<b>Spacebar</b>	Click the Notification bar
